- 35 1 vase, homegrown, mixed flowering stems, between 5 – 10 stems in total.

The Rules as directed by 'Garden News'

1 vase, mixed flowering stems – fresh, homegrown - containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems, requiring a minimum of two different kinds of flowers.

(note: two different kinds - two varieties of the same flower are not two kinds)

No dried or silk flowers are allowed. No seed heads or berries are allowed, no accessories such as bows or additional foliage are allowed. (Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem and is still attached to that stem is permitted).

Packing material, e.g. floral foam is permitted.

Vase will be viewed from all directions. It can be any shape or size, in proportion to the display. There are no marks for the vase itself.

The judges' decision is collective and final.
