Chairman's Report:

It is a pleasure to report that our Society has had another successful year.

Our winter gatherings were well supported and our experiment of switching the January and February meetings to an afternoon slot proved very popular, so I think this practice is now well established.

Our summer programme kicked off as normal with the Coffee Morning and Plant Sale and again this was very well supported. The fact that we are one of the few groups left to hold coffee mornings makes it a particularly popular event.

38 people attended the summer outing to Scone Palace and Branklyn gardens. The weather was kind to us and everyone had a great time. (Mind you, afternoon tea in Nardini's in 2024 after visiting Culzean Castle and gardens was a hard act to follow). Next year we are talking about a possible outing to Benmore Botanic gardens and Inverary castle gardens.

We approached the Flower Show at end of August with fear and trepidation because of the mixture of weather conditions - you will remember the drought of July followed by wet and colder weather in August. Once again, our exhibitors turned up trumps, and we had an excellent Flower Show.

One of our long-standing judges and supporter George Irvine sadly was in poorer health this summer, and could not take part. However, John Currie (Largs Horti Soc) stepped in at short notice to judge the Vegetables section, and we are grateful to him. Andy Aitken who for many years exhibited prize-winning dahlias and onions had given up his allotment last winter, and has now established himself as a judge for local groups. We value his expertise in many fields, and thank him for judging the Cut Flowers section this year. There are a few minor changes and additions to the 2026 schedule, which can be viewed on our website now, and printed copies will be delivered early in the Springtime.

The Garden at the Cross has had a good year with many positive comments from passers-by. As before, I am always looking for any help to keep the weeds in check.

I am grateful for the enthusiasm from the committee, and from the various helpers who step forward when needed. We are always open to volunteers to join the committee, or to be a helper. My thanks to Sheena who has completed a three year stint on committee and is stepping down this year.

I would wish to thank Susan, in charge at the village centre, plus Lewis and Willie for their help at all our functions.

And last but not least, my sincere thanks to Jill our secretary, treasurer and general organizer.

Treasurers' Report

Jill reported on a good year for the finances.

70% of members have paid their annual subscription of £8. – Thank you.

The coffee morning/plant sale is our main fundraising event, entrance tickets and plant sales brought a net income of £672. Expenditure is still high, with the annual show costing a net of £516. Hall rent and lectures fees/expenses cost £846, Postage, printing, sundries cost £446, and a small subsidy of £101 was needed for the summer outing. Our year ends with a small Surplus of £32.68.

Funds in the current account, investment account and petty cash amount to £3373.19. Given the poor support that other horticultural societies are facing, the committee feel that our society is doing very well indeed - thank you !!!

All invoices, receipts and summaries are on the desk here for you to peruse later.

Thank you to Gordon McGibbon for auditing the accounts. There were no questions.

Approval and acceptance of the accounts were requested and given unanimously.
